After providing a meeting point for local groups for 16 years, the Council felt that the Heath Hayes Cabin had become a financial liability and beyond economic repair. It was removed in June 2018 and the area restored as a car park



OUR GREEN POLICIES

We were the first Parish Council in the country to be awarded "Green Achiever" status.

- The Hayes Green Centre has a high efficiency boiler, is well insulated, timed sensor lights and thermostats on radiators.
- We promote recycling and have information on our noticeboards and website.
- We send all documents, report and mail by email if possible. All Christmas cards are sent electronically at no cost to the Council.
- The Clerk uses an electric cycle (50 miles on 4p charge) for work wherever possible.
- We are looking at linking up national footpaths and cycleways to encourage healthier lifestyles and reducing vehicle use.


GRANT SCHEME

The Council has started the annual grant procedure, with forms available in October.

Cannel Mount, Wimblebury.

The Council was the only successful applicant to the County Council Countryside Review and a 100 year lease has been agreed for the Parish Council to manage the 8 acre site known as Cannel Mount in Wimblebury, to the east of John Street and Wimblebury Road.

The Parish Council has started work on a short, medium and long term plans to better manage the area on behalf of the residents.

It is hoped that the area will have more accessible footpaths, car parking, picnic area, disabled access and links to existing and future walking and cycling routes. Sources of funding will be identified and pursued to mitigate any cost of the improvements.

We also want to work with local groups and schools, Land Trust, Cannock Council, Staffordshire County Council, the Forest of Mercia and the Staffordshire Wildlife Trust to improve the area in an environmentally sympathetic way.

The Council has purchased and installed a bench at Wimblebury.


