We were the first Parish Council in the country to be awarded "Green Achiever" status.

- The Hayes Green Centre has a high efficiency boiler, is well insulated, timed sensor lights and thermostats on radiators.
- We promote recycling and have information on our noticeboard and website.
- We send all documents, report and mail by email if possible. All Christmas cards are sent electronically at no cost to the Council.
- The Clerk uses an electric cycle (50 miles on 4p charge) for work wherever possible.
- We are looking at linking up national footpaths and cycleways to encourage healthier lifestyles and reducing vehicle use.


# Grants Available

The Council has a 100 year lease has been agreed for the Parish Council to manage the 8 acre site known as Cannel Mount in Wimblebury and has started work plans to better manage the area on behalf of the residents. It is hoped that the area will have more accessible footpaths, car parking, picnic area, disabled access and links to existing and future walking and cycling routes. Sources of funding will be identified and pursued to mitigate any cost of the improvements.

We want to work with local groups and schools, Land Trust, Cannock Council, Staffordshire County Council, the Forest of Mercia and the Staffordshire Wildlife Trust to improve the area in an environmentally sympathetic way. We have started this and were very pleased to welcome staff and pupils from Kingsmead School for a four day project in July.
