

Heath Hayes & Wimblebury Parish Council

Annual Report June 2009

1. Summary of major points.

- The Precept is £58,400. The cost of the Council to the residents of the area has reduced for the sixth year in a row and is now 27% lower than 2003.
- Heath Hayes Cabin again has the highest income ever.
- Following the major refurbishment of the Hayes Green Community, we have continued to maintain the Centre at the same high standard.
- The Council has awarded £8,373 awarded to local organisations.
- Our Clerk won one five national bursaries to attend the World Clerks' Conference in May 09.

2. Introduction.

The Council, in Cannock Chase, Staffordshire, has 13 Councillors representing the four wards of New Heath Hayes, Old Heath Hayes, Hawks Green and Wimblebury.

Four Councillors represent Old Heath Hayes and three each for New Heath Hayes, Hawks Green and Wimblebury.

5. Communication.

The Council publishes a quarterly newsletter that is distributed to every household and business in the area. Additional copies can be obtained from Heath Hayes Library, Hayes Green Community Centre or by contacting the Clerk.

All the minutes and agendas for the last five years are on the Council website, as well as the meeting dates for the next four years.

In the last year, the Council sent over 500 letters, made or received over 2,000 phone calls and dealt with in excess of 5,000 emails.

6. Chair's Report – 2008/09 - From the Annual Parish Meeting 6th May 2009 – Councillor M. Doody.

Thank you for allowing me to serve as Chairman for the last year. First of all, I would like to congratulate Mr Tim Brooks and Mrs Joy Berwick.

Tim Brooks has been awarded a Certificate of Good Citizenship for his voluntary work in the area, assisting with Remembrance Day and other events and especially for the work that he does with his family with the Ignite Café.

Joy Berwick has been awarded a Certificate of Good Citizenship for her work with the homeless and at the Bourne Methodist Church, again over many years.

We are grateful for their attendance and for their contribution.

We also celebrate the Jasmine Restaurant of Hednesford Road, Heath Hayes for their many years of providing a well used facility for the community. We are lucky to have this business here.

Now, what has the Council done over the last year? I can tell you that I am very proud of this report and this Council. The last year has again been very successful.

The Heath Hayes Cabin last year raised £3,161 in hire fees, the highest ever. The Hayes Green Community Centre has been maintained at the high standard it was after the refurbishment and is in use every day of the week.

We have raised over £5,000 to producing a map of the area and delivering it to every house in the area. It is hoped this project will be completed in the next few months.

In the last year, we have donated $\pounds 8,372$ to local groups and we continue to support organisations that benefit the area.

We continue to operate a website, totally free of charge, that has every meetings agenda and minutes for the last five years as well as many other articles and links.

As a Council, we provide the best value that we can. We have reduced the tax burden each and every year in the last six years, the Band D annual charge has reduced by 27% in that time.

I have been on the Council since it was formed in 1988, and last year was one of our best years.

We have continued to build on our success following the award of Quality Status in 2006 and plans are in hand for the re-accreditation which is due next year.

We have undertaken a major financial review and have looked at every aspect of income and expenditure to make sure that we are operating as efficiently as possible.

I want to congratulate our Clerk, Ray Smythe, who has won a competition to be one of five national representatives to attend the World Town Clerks Conference in Chicago in May. This is another great honour and his attendance at the conference will be beneficial for him and this Council.

This is the Council's 21st year and we have made a lot of progress in that time. We have had a lot of success in the last few years and I hope that the next year will continue to be as successful and that we continue to be a benefit to the area.

9. Heath Hayes Cabin

- The Cabin was installed by the Parish Council and provides an affordable meeting place for local groups.
- The Community Action Team, Police, PCSO's, Streetwardens and the County Council Youth Service have free use to help the community.
- Hire Charges remain unchanged at £4.25 an hour or £15 for four hours. Despite the unchanged hire charge that, last year we raised £3,161 in hire fees, the highest ever. It is used most days of the week.
- A rebate has been received from Inland Revenue for voluntary online filing.



• We have successfully applied for rate relief, saving £1,118.

10. Hayes Green Community Centre.

- The Hayes Green Community Centre on Heath Way was taken over by the Parish Council to save it from closure. It is a community facility that can be hired by individuals or groups for parties, events or classes.
- Just over 12 months ago, the Centre has underwent a huge internal and external refurbishment and is now a first class facility. The main hirer is Stepping Stones Nursery which operates between 8.30am to 6.00pm Monday to Friday and the Centre is in use every day of the week.

- The Centre is used for Community Forum meetings and as a Polling Station.
- The Centre is registered with the District Council as a major emergency venue.
- A rebate have been received from Inland Revenue for voluntary online filing.
- Grants have been used to install a new boiler and to purchase 24 folding lightweight tables and two trolleys.
- We have successfully applied for rate relief, saving £4,536.
